## Historical Happenings

- January 14      Rosenberg, Oregon  
Anti-noise ordinance in Rosenberg bans use of cowbells at night.
- March 4        Washington, D.C.  
Benjamin Harrison sworn in as 23<sup>rd</sup> President of United States, Levi P. Morton as Vice President.
- March 18      Milwaukee, Wisconsin  
Pabst takes over Milwaukee brewery. In a move that could produce one of the largest breweries in the nation, Captain Frederick Pabst has reorganized the Philip Best Company into the Pabst Brewery Company.
- May 1         Atlanta, Georgia  
Asa Briggs Candler of Atlanta has bought the rights to a local drink, Coca-Cola, derived from the kola nut. The bottled drink was first made on May 8, 1886, as a syrup to help dyspepsia and headaches by John Styth Pemberton, who then mixed it with carbonated water at Dr. Joseph Jacob's Pharmacy.
- May 31        Johnstown, Pennsylvania  
In one of the worst catastrophes of American history, Johnstown in south-central Pennsylvania was washed off the map today by a flood of awesome power. After two days of heavy rains, the old dam at the end of a three mile reservoir gave way. The flood swept through the valley with the force of a tidal wave taking houses, factories and bridges. Approximately 2000 people were killed.
- July 23        Richburg, Mississippi  
John L. Sullivan put away Jake Kilrain today after 75 bruising rounds in what may be the last bare-knuckle bout for the world title. In his future contests, Sullivan plans to wear gloves under the popular Marquess of Queensbury rules.
- November 11   Washington, D.C.  
President Cleveland today signed a bill that puts an end to four years of political wrangling and clears the way for the territories of Washington, Montana, North and South Dakota to become states.
- November 26   Lynn, Massachusetts  
Some 80 acres in the central business district gutted by fire that started in the engine room of a wooden shoe factory.
- Hartford, Connecticut  
A patent has been granted for a coin-operated telephone, a device that will be maintained in public places, and can be activated only by placing a coin the a slot.
